

We'll tour, enjoy lunch, and visit the many shops right on the orchard property! Our next stop is really something to see, Dreamcycle Motorcycle Museum, which is about so much more than just the machines themselves. The stories each cycle tells is fascinating and the owner considers each a work of art. We will be amazed! Tonight enjoy dinner on your own and explore more of the resort.

Day 5 - Kamloops to Whistler, BC

Our coach ride will take us through some beautiful countryside, including a photo stop at breathtaking Seton Lake, as we journey along to Whistler. Nestled at the base of Whistler and Blackcomb Mountains, this pedestrian-only village has countless walkways, patio restaurants, shopping, on-mountain adventures and more! Once we've descended the mountain, the remainder of the afternoon and evening is free to explore the villages of Whistler Blackcomb on your own.


